Day 01Arrive Delhiflight (not included)Welome to Delhi. Namaste! Clear immigration and customs. Our representative will be waiting in
the arrival lounge to assist you and transfer you to
your hotel.

Delhi, the capital of India has a fascinating history and a stimulating present. Delhi has been the seat of a power of a number of dynasties – the Rajputs, the Muslims invaders from the North, the Afghan dynasties followed by Tughlaqs, Sayyads, the Ladies and the Mughals, who continued the Imperial line, until British days. **The old city**, built by Shah Jehan in the 17th century, stands today as an epitome of the



whole history of Indo-Islamic architecture. New Delhi, designed and constructed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and Sir Herbert Baker is a mixture of east and west. Thepublic buildings in red sandstone are in the Mughal style. **New Delhi**, has a circular Parliament House and an imposing Central Secretariat in two blocks, which stand at the approaches to Rashtrapati Bhavan, the residence of the President of India. Delhi is today the political, economic and cultural capital of the world's largest democracy and has also become one of the greatest tourist centers of the world.

Overnight: Hotel

Day 02 Delhi Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and proceed on a guided tour of **Old Delhi**, to explore its history, architecture and life.

Our first destination would be the **Jama Masjid**. Built in 1423, this is one of the largest mosques in

India, and a sight of historical importance. Begun in 1644, the mosque was not completed until 1658. It has three gateways, four angle towers and two minarets standing 40m high and constructed of altering vertical strips of red sandstone and white marble.

Then, enjoy a cycle rickshaw ride through the **Chandani Chowk market & Khari Baowli**-famous spice market in Old Delhi (remain closed on Sundays) We then drive towards the **Red Fort (closed on Mondays)** built in red sand stone. The walls of the Red Fort extend for 2 km and vary in height from 18m on the river side to 33m on the city side. Shah Jahan started construction of the massive fort in 1638 and it was completed in 1648. The Red Fort dates from the vary peak of Mughal power.

Also visit **Raj Ghat**, the place where Mahatma Gandhi was cremated.

While driving back to the hotel visit **India Gate** (War Memorial), drive past the **President's House**, **Parliament House** and the **Secretarial buildings**.

Evening at leisure.

Overnight: Hotel (B)

Day 03 Delhi Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and proceed on a guided tour of **New Delhi**.

We will visit **Qutab Minar** - 234 feet high tower. The Qutab Minar itself is a soaring tower of victory that was started in 1193, immediately after the defeat of the last Hindu kingdom in Delhi. It is nearly 73m high and tapers from a 15m diameter base to just 2.5m at the top. The tower has five distinct stories.



Continue to visit the **Tomb of Mughal Emperor Humayun**. Built in the mid-16th century by Haji Begum, the Persian-born senior wife of Humayun, the second Mughal emperor, this is a wonderful early example of Mughal architecture. The elements in its design – a squat building, high arched entrances that let in light, topped by a bulbous dome and surrounded by formal gardens – were to be refined over the years to the magnificence of the Taj Mahal in Agra.

Rest of the day at leisure.

Overnight: Hotel (B)

Day 04 Delhi / Agra – 220 kms / 4 hrs Breakfast at the hotel.

08:00 am pick up from the hotel lobby and proceed on your drive to Agra





Arrive and check in at the hotel.

After check in, depart for a guided tour to visit the world famous Taj Mahal.

The Taj Mahal (Closed on Fridays) is a symbol of eternal love, which stands on the banks of River

Yamuna. It was built by the 5th Mughal Emperor, Shah Jahan in the year 1631 in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It was completed in 22 years. The Taj Mahal is widely recognized as "the jewel of Muslim art in India and one the universally admired of masterpieces of the world's heritage". It is regarded by many as the finest example of Mughal architecture, in that it combines elements from Persian and Indian architectural styles. In 1983, the Taj Mahal became a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Return back to the hotel for overnight.

Overnight: Hotel (B)

Day 05 Optional:

Early morning depart to visit the Taj Mahal during sunrise (Subject to weather conditions).

Return back to the hotel for breakfast.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and depart for a guided tour of Agra city. Here we get to see:

The Agra Fort: The crescent-shaped fort is enclosed by its 20-metre high, 2.4 km long outer wall. The fort contains a maze of buildings forming a small city within a city. Jehangir's palace commissioned by Akbar was the largest private residence in the fort. The Diwan-i-Aam


(hall of public audience) and Diwan-i-Khas (hall of private audience) were built by Shah Jahan for receiving audiences.

Itmad-ud-Daula Tomb also known as **BABY TAJ** - One of the most beautiful Mughal tombs was built by Nur Jahan, the Empress of Jahangir for her father in 1628. The mausoleum is entirely made of white marble and graced with intricate decoration of inlay work and marble-screen work belonging to the Islamic style. With its tranquil, small garden on the bank of Yamuna River, the tomb stands impressively elegant from a distance.

You will also get an opportunity to visit one of the **marble cutting factories to witness a marble carving/cutting demonstration**.

Overnight: Hotel (B)







Day 06 Agra / Ranthambore via Fatehpur Sikri – 265 kms / 6 hrs Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and proceed on your drive to Ranthambhore en-route visiting Fatehpur Sikri built by the Mughal Emperor Akbar during 1564 A.D. Mughal Emperor Akbar had no heir. He visited holy men to enlist their prayers for a son. When he visited Sheikh Salim Chishti who was living at the village of Sikri, the saint foretold the emperor that he would be blessed with a son. When his son was born, he constructed his capital city and named it Fatehpur Sikri. Later, due to shortage of



water and unrest in the region, Akbar had to abandon the city. After the visit, continue on your drive to Ranthambhore.

Arrive and check in at the hotel.

Ranthambhore National Park or Sawai Madhipur is known to have India's Friendliest tigers Assured of protection, these nocturnal creatures are seen often in the day. Sprawled on the Aravalli and Vindhya ranges of Rajasthan, Ranthambore National Park encompasses an area of 410 SQ km in which live a healthy population of about 40 tigers. A large number of deer inhabit the area and leopards are also occasionally sighted.

Day 07

Ranthambore

Early morning depart for your first jeep safari in the Ranthambore National Park. Return to the hotel for breakfast.

You have free time until your afternoon safari in the park.

Day 08 Ranthambore / Jaipur - 150 kms / 3 hrs Early morning depart for a final safari in the Park by jeep.

Return to the hotel for breakfast.

Check out and depart for Jaipur. Arrive and check in at the hotel.

Jaipur: The rose-pink capital of Rajasthan is surrounded on all sides by rugged hills, crowned with forts and enclosed by embattled walls. Houses with latticed windows line the streets, their rose-pink colour lending enchantment to the scene which is almost magical at sunset. Jaipur is aptly called the 'Pink City of

India'. It takes its name from the famous Maharana Sawai Jai Singh, who founded the city in 1728.

Jaipur is noted for its craft men skilled in the art of cutting precious stones and famed for its garnets and rubies. It is equally well known for brass inlay work, lacquer work and the printing of muslins.

Overnight: Hotel (B)

Day 09 Jaipur Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and depart for a guided sightseeing tour to Amber Fort and the city of Jaipur.

Amber Fort. Ascend to the fort by Elephant or Jeep ride. This is the former capital of the royal Rajputs. Set on the dry wrinkled Aravali Hills, and surrounded by fortified battlements, the palace straddles two tundra hills overlooking Maota Lake.

In the afternoon, visit Jaipur City:

Hawa Mahal or Palace of the Winds, a five-storied structure of pink sand stone with semioctagonal and delicately honeycombed windows overlooking the main street of the old city. It was built in 1799 so that veiled royal woman could peer down unseen by the world through its 593 stone screens.

We proceed for a guided tour of the **City Palace & Museum**. The City Palace in the heart of the old city is a blend of Rajasthani and Mughal architecture. The center of the palace is a seven storied building called Chandra Palace with fine views over the gardens and the city.

Next stop is the **Solar Observatory** - an astronomical treasure house with solar devices that gives accurate predictions till date.

You will get an opportunity to visit one of **the Art & Craft** factories and see a demonstration of gem cutting & polishing. Jaipur is noted for craftsmen skilled in the art of cutting precious stones and famed for its garnets and rubies. It is equally well known for brass inlay work, lacquer work and the printing of muslins.

Udaipur stands in a valley, amid green hills on the banks of the wide, steel blue lake Pichola. On little islands in the lake, from the water's edge, arise marble palaces of pure white that glisten like fairy castles. Crowning the ridge along the shores of the lake is the palace of the Maharaja.

This afternoon depart to on a **boat ride on Lake Pichola.** Visit the Jag Niwas Palace by

motor launch. The palace, built of granite and marble, covers four acres and is built in the lake. Visit the Borra Mahal, Khas Mahal and the courts, gardens and fountains.

This afternoon proceed on a sightseeing tour city to visit the **Sahelion Ki Bari** (Queen's retreat for her friends), a drive around **Fateh Sagar Lake**-a man-made lake and The **City Palace**, one of the most important attractions in Udaipur. It has several exotic palatial structures that enchant with their carved walls, latticework, mirror work etc. Also visit **Jagdish Temple** and **Gulab Niwas Garden**.

Check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport to board your flight for Mumbai. On arrival in Mumbai you are met and transferred to your hotel.

Mumbai, is a major port of India and also a great industrial center. A cosmopolitan city, it owes its prosperity to the industry and enterprise of its population of about eight million. It is the commercial capital of India.

Afternoon depart for a guided sightseeing tour of Mumbai visiting:

Gateway of India. The Gateway of India is a mammoth structure that bears a testimony to a number of historical events. It was originally built to commemorate the grand arrival of King George V and Queen Mary to India in 1911.

Mani Bhawan. A memorial dedicated to the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi. He used to stay at House No.19 called Mani Bhavan. The building now contains a pictorial gallery, a 20,000 volume research library, a film and recording archive and a set of diorama on the Mahatma's life.





Crawford Market._Named after Bombay's first municipal commissioner, Arthur Crawford, the covered market dominates the skyline with its clock tower and steeple. It was the main wholesale market for fruits in Bombay until March 1996, when the wholesale traders were relocated to New Bombay.

Victoria Terminus. A magnificent building, completed in 1888. Construction started in 1878 based on a design by **F. W. Stevens**, It is now the starting point of the Central Railways. The Victoria Terminus was renamed Chhatrapati Sivaji Terminus on March 4, 1996.

Overnight: Hotel (B)

Day 13 Mumbai Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and depart for an excursion to Elephanta Caves.

Elephanta Caves (closed on Mondays) known as Gharapuri (fortress city). The 7th century cave temple complex, which has been carved out of rock under two small hills, is dedicated to Lord Shiva and was a flourishing place of pilgrimage. The main cave, which is known as Elephanta, is supported by massive pillars. Inside is the main hall housing sculptures of various gods in the Hindu mythology. This well-known tourist spot is accessible by boat from the Gateway of India.

Rest of the day at leisure.

Day 14 Depart Mumbai Breakfast at the hotel.

Pick up from the hotel lobby and transfer to the International Airport to board your flight back home.

Food, water and beverages: The food, water and beverages may not be up to North-American standards. Accordingly, customers assume sole responsibility for any illness suffered while abroad or upon return owing to the quality of the food, water and beverages.

16. ROOM ALLOCATION: Hoteliers are solely responsible for room allocation, in accordance with the category reserved by customers. Should customers choose to alter their room category upon arrival at destination (upon availability), they must make their own arrangements with the hotelier and assume all additional fees levied by them.

17. CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT CONDITIONS: Customers acknowledge and accept that hoteliers, in accordance with international standards, have specific check-in times. usually from 3 PM and check out by noon on the scheduled day of departure or by noon on the day immediately preceding a late night departure.

18. CUSTOMERS REQUIRING ASSISTANCE AND CARE WHILE TRAVELLING

All customers requiring special care, assistance, attention or treatment must advise Tourcan Vacations and the air carrier of any and all specific needs at the time of booking, in order to arrange air transportation, hotel and tour accommodations.

19. CHANGES TO TRAVEL SERVICES:

If Travel Services are no longer available prior to the departure date or subsequent to arrival at destination, Tourcan Vacations reserves the right to substitute them for comparable goods or Travel Services, or, alternatively, to cancel them. Changes to itinerary: Tourcan Vacations and the participating tour operator reserves the right to cancel, alter or re-schedule any timing, to omit one or more stops, to substitute

alternative itineraries or to otherwise amend the content of the tour with or without prior notice to the passenger.

20. CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITY

Health: Customers, whose physical condition so requires, must ensure that they have a sufficient quantity of any required medication with them, and that they carry such medication in their hand baggage at all times. Customers must also consult competent medical authorities prior to departure about preventive medical measure as regards to the countries to be visitad

Activities: Tourcan Vacations cannot be held responsible for any accident or mishap occurring at the destination during the practice of activities in which the customers participate of their own free will and initiative

21. FORCE MAJEURE: Tourcan Vacations shall not be liable for failure in the performance of any of its obligations, including without limitation, for any loss or damage resulting from any delay, cancellation, loss of personal belongings, illness, bodily injury, accident, death, deterioration of Travel Services, inconvenience, loss of enjoyment, disappointment or frustration, either mental or physical, due to:

An Act of God or Force Majeure;

A war, revolution, insurrection, riot, blockage or any other unlawful act against public order or authority, including an act of terrorism or threat thereof:

* Fire, flood, explosion, earthquak, epidemics, quarantine, storm, lightning, tornado or adverse weather conditions generally; * Accident to or failure of an aircraft or equipment used in connection therewith, loss of or hijacking of an aircraft, or any shortage of or inability to provide labor, fuel or facilities;

Any strike, lock-out, labor dispute or other industrial disturbance whether involving Tourcan Vacations' employees, the employees of its service providers or others upon whom Tourcan Vacations relies:

* Any other causes beyond the reasonable control of Tourcan Vacations and any other event not reasonably to be foreseen, anticipated or predicted, whether actual, threatened or

reported, which may interfere with the operations of Tourcan Vacations or of its service providers.

22. EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY: Tourcan Vacations makes arrangements with air carriers, hotels, transfer operators and other independent parties to provide customers with Travel Services they purchase. Although Tourcan Vacations takes great care in selecting these service providers, it does not have any control over them and cannot be held responsible for their omissions, fault or negligence, or that of their employees, nor for any loss or damages suffered as a result thereof.

Travel Services provided are subject to the conditions imposed by the service providers and their liability is limited by their tariffs, conditions of carriage, tickets, vouchers, international conventions and agreements

23. ACTIVITIES NOT INCLUDED: Tourcan Vacations shall not be liable for the quality or safety of activities (such as excursions, optional tours, little extras and others) available at the destination that customers may wish to participate in and which are not included in the package, nor for any other representation made by the operator of any such activities. Any written or oral contract for all such activities shall be deemed to be made between customers and the operator of such activities and shall be undertaken at the customers' own risk of loss, damage or injury. Tourcan Vacations shall not be liable in any manner for any complaints or claims that may arise as a result of participation in any such activities which are offered by third parties over whom Tourcan Vacations has no control.

24. CONFIDENTIALITY: Tourcan Vacations strictly complies with principles of confidentiality with respect to customers' personal information, including in accordance with the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act.

25. LAWS: The laws of the province in which the Canadian gateway city is located govern this agreement. Any legal action instituted against Tourcan Vacations must be heard before the courts of this province. For the purposes of any such proceedings, the parties hereby agree to elect domicile in the judicial district of the Canadian gateway city in question. The voiding of one or other of the clauses hereto shall neither annul nor invalidate this agreement, which is known as the Terms and Conditions. Tourcan Vacations is registered as a wholesaler in Ontario.
